

ZANESVILLE COMMUNITY THEATRE HISTORY

Background:

- * Southeastern Ohio is a rural region, lacking any large urban areas. Zanesville, with a population of approximately 26,000, is one of the largest cities in the area. With the state capital, one hour away, amateur theatre is thriving in this small town.
- * The Zanesville Community Theatre was founded in 1963 by a small group of residents interested in presenting theatrical productions. Many of those original founders were professional people—a judge, a college professor and engineer. They were very serious about maintaining the quality of their avocation.
- * The Zanesville Community Theatre, the oldest continuously operating theater in the area, currently owns a circa 1913 building in the historic McIntire Terrace District. The structure was originally constructed as a synagogue, but has also been home to several Christian congregations prior to its use as a performance space.
- * Five to seven theatrical pieces are produced annually by the organization. The Zanesville Community Theatre has education as the centerpiece of its mission statement, so each season's offerings usually include one classic, such as plays by Shakespeare. Original pieces by new or unpublished playwrights are becoming an increasingly important staple in the annual list of productions.
- * The Zanesville Community Theatre has offered a starting place for many young people who have gone on to make careers in the theater. The community theater movement continues to offer a creative outlet to those who have experienced theater careers, or who are talented amateurs.

- * Zanesville Community Theatre, Inc. (ZCT) is a wholly volunteer organization, having no paid staff positions.
- * ZCT serves the Zanesville and Southeastern Ohio areas.
- * ZCT is dedicated to the production of plays, musicals, and other dramatic presentations; and to the education of our members and the communities we serve in theatrical techniques and presentations.
- * ZCT's first show was in November 1963.
- * ZCT is a 501(c)(3) non-profit.

HOW TO SIGN-UP FOR A ZCT PICK AND PLAY PROGRAM

When: Choose a date and time convenient for your troop/group. We ask that you select alternate dates and times to best fit your group into the ZCT program calendar. All Pick & Play programs are subject to instructor availability.

Where: Zanesville Community Theatre, 940 Findley Avenue, Zanesville, Ohio 43701.

Time: All programs will be 2 hours in length. Please arrive 15 minutes early to allow for bathroom breaks before the program starts.

Fee: All Pick and Play programs are \$8.00 per participant. Add \$1.00 per participant if fee is late or paid at the door. Payment should be sent upon receipt of confirmation packet and included invoice.

Registration Deadline: Thirty (30) days before chosen date.

Min/Max: 6/40

Note: Confirmation packets will include directions to ZCT and an invoice. A minimum of 2 supervising adults must accompany each troop/group. No tagalongs. Come comfortably dressed in clothing that allows you to move. Tennis shoes are recommended.
